SOUTHURY, CONNECTICUT – The Town of Southbury has proposed a project to rehabilitate the pavement on Main Street South between Garage Road and Brown Road. The project is in the design phase and has been recommended for construction under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 administered by the Connecticut Department of Transportation.

It is the Town's and the State's policy to keep persons informed and involved when such projects are undertaken. It is important that the community share its concerns to assist in the project's development.

The Town is planning to mill, repair and resurface approximately 5,800 feet of Main Street South and install new traffic control signage as required, line striping and pavement markings.

Based upon a preliminary assessment, the construction cost will be roughly \$600,000. It is anticipated that the Federal Highway Administration will provide approximately 81% of the construction cost through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. The federal funding will be capped at \$488,638. It is projected the construction of this project will be performed during the spring of 2010.
