Complaint #14-001

Stipulation of Facts

Mr. Chris Radlicz, an elected alternate member of the Town of Southbury Planning Commission hereby stipulates to the following facts with regards to Ethics Complaint #14-001:

- 1. Section M of the existing Town of Southbury Code of Ethics/Conflict of Interest Ordinance (approved on xxx) states in part as follows:
- "Alternate Members of all boards, commissions and committees are expected to attend all meetings of such boards, commissions and committees."
- 2. On or about December 27, 2013, town resident Jon Norris (hereinafter, "Complainant") submitted an ethics complaint to the Ethics Commission of the Town of Southbury alleging a violation of the Town's Code of Ethics/Conflict of Interest Ordinance.
- 3. In 2013, Mr. Radlicz attended a total of 4 meetings of the Planning Commission, 1 Regular meeting and 3 Special meetings. The total number of meetings of the Planning Commission in 2013 was 17 meetings, 10 Regular meetings and 7 Special meetings.
- 4. Mr. Radlicz did conform to all procedures, processes, and bylaws established by the Planning Commission as part of its operations as regards attendance.

Conclusion

Mr. Radlicz attendance performance is a technical violation of the Ethics Code, because Mr. Radlicz was expected to show up for all of the 2013 meetings of the Planning Commission and did not. However, he did conform to all established Planning Commission attendance requirements.

Resolution

Mr. Radlicz has indicated that he will continue to attend as many Planning Commission meetings as possible going forward.
